

## High and Extreme Severity Events: March 23, 2026

### Conflict Between US, Israel, Gulf Countries and Iran

#### United Arab Emirates (UAE)

- The Ministry of Defense confirmed air defense systems were active nationwide on the morning of March 23, 2026, due to incoming missile and Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) threats.
- Explosions heard across the UAE were the result of air defense systems intercepting aerial targets.
- A ballistic missile was intercepted over Abu Dhabi during the overnight hours of March 22-23, 2026.
- Debris from the interception fell in the Al Shawamekh area of Abu Dhabi, injuring one Indian national.
- The Abu Dhabi Media Office advised citizens to obtain information only from official sources and avoid spreading unverified information.
- The extreme risk level reflects the ongoing threat of Iranian missile and UAV intrusions targeting the UAE.

#### Saudi Arabia

- The Ministry of Defense confirmed the successful interception and destruction of a ballistic missile launched towards the Riyadh area during the early morning hours of March 23, 2026.
- One missile fell in an uninhabited area, in addition to the intercepted missile.
- The extreme risk level indicates the continued threat of Iranian missile and UAV attacks targeting Saudi Arabia.
- Authorities urged residents to follow instructions regarding sirens and shelters.

#### Bahrain

- The Ministry of Interior confirmed air raid sirens were sounded nationwide during the early morning hours of March 23, 2026.
- Citizens and residents were urged to remain calm and proceed to the nearest safe place.
- The extreme risk level reflects the threat of Iranian missile and UAV intrusions targeting Bahrain.

#### Israel

- Color Red sirens were sounded in northern Israel's Metulla and Misgav Am at 04:42 local time on March 23, 2026.
- Color Red sirens were also sounded in northern Israel's Margaliot and Manara at 01:55 local time during the overnight hours of March 22-23, 2026.
- The extreme risk level indicates ongoing rocket threats in northern Israel.
- Residents were advised to ensure working environments are within reach of bomb shelters and safe rooms.
- Authorities emphasized the importance of locking steel windows and doors in Residential Protected Rooms (Mamads) for safety.
