## Executive Brief: US – Israeli Operations Against Iran and Regional Implications

---

**Explainer:** This daily report provides an executive summary of major developments related to the ongoing war in the Middle East. ### Operational Overview

US and Israeli military operations in Iran are still suspended since the entry into force of the 14-day ceasefire, as of April 17. The ceasefire continues, and Iran is refraining from attacking Israel or any of its regional neighbors directly.

US Secretary of War Hegseth held a press conference on April 16, together with Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Caine and CENTCOM Commander Admiral Cooper. Hegseth stated that the US military is ready to renew the war if required and that it is observing Iran's effort to dig out its severed capabilities that were previously struck, and indicated that the US is watching these movements. He also stated that "at the direction of President Trump, the War Department will ensure that Iran never has a nuclear weapon. We prefer to do it the nice way...or we can do it the hard way. We urge the new regime to choose wisely."

General Caine stated that as of April 16, the US naval blockade on Iran remains in effect. The US Navy has not been required to board any ship for non-compliance thus far.

### Negotiations-related developments

On April 16, US President Trump suggested that Iran had agreed to give away its nuclear dust [enriched uranium]. There has been no Iranian confirmation, and a date for a second round of negotiations has not yet been set, as of April 17.

### Other notable developments

**Israel-Lebanon:** A ten-day ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah commenced during the overnight hours of April 16-17. Both parties have upheld the truce since it entered into force.

Israeli Prime Minister Netanyahu stated that there is an opportunity to make a historic peace agreement with Lebanon and that President Trump intends to invite him and Lebanese President Michel Aoun to Washington to work for it. He added that Israel refused to accept two conditions demanded by Hezbollah



for the truce, namely that Israeli forces would retreat to the international border and that the truce would be based on a “quiet for quiet” approach. He stated that Israel retains a ten-km buffer zone within Lebanese territory.

**Strait of Hormuz:** The UK and France are preparing to hold an international summit on Strait of Hormuz security on April 17.

### Travel & Security Aspects

- On April 16, the US embassy in Oman lifted its shelter-in-place directive for all areas of Oman except Musandam and its surrounding area. US embassy staff are prohibited from traveling to Musandam and Masirah Island due to potential travel disruptions, and from traveling more than 25 km offshore due to naval activity.
