

Middle East Situation

Information Cut-Off: 0730h (GMT), 25 March 2026

Executive Summary

Conflict has continued overnight despite claims by President Trump that negotiations are ongoing, which continue to be denied by Iran.

Iran has fired missiles towards Israel and the Gulf, causing a fire at Kuwait International Airport this morning.

Airstrikes in Iran have been reported overnight in Tehran and Qazvin.

Iran

Airstrikes this morning have been reported in Tehran and Qazvin, with injuries and damage currently unconfirmed.

An airstrike in a residential area of Tehran's Varamin killed 12 people and injured 28 others last night, according to state media.

Last night, a projectile struck the perimeter of the Bushehr nuclear power plant. No technical damage or injuries have been reported at the site.

Israel

One person died and two others were injured by Hezbollah rocket fire near Safed yesterday. This is the first confirmed death caused by Hezbollah fire since fighting began.

Drones and rockets have triggered sirens in northern areas this morning, while Iranian missile fire triggered sirens in central and southern areas. No injuries or damage have been reported so far. Iranian missile fire injured 12 people in Bnei Brak last night.

The Health Ministry announced this morning that 204 people have been injured and hospitalised due to the conflict in the last 24 hours. One person is in serious condition, nine are in moderate condition, and the remainder are in good condition. Since fighting began, 19 people have been killed, and 5,045 others have been admitted to the hospital.

United States

US media claim that President Trump has delivered a 15-point ceasefire plan to Iran. President Trump added that Iran had sent him a gift associated with oil and gas, and that Vice President JD Vance, Secretary of State Marco Rubio, and other officials were involved in negotiations.

This comes as 5,000 marines and approximately 2,000 soldiers from the 82nd Airborne Division are being deployed to the region. Over 50,000 soldiers are already stationed at military bases throughout the Middle East.

Regional

Kuwait

A drone struck a fuel tank and caused a fire at Kuwait International Airport this morning. No casualties have been reported, and the airspace was already closed.

Saudi Arabia

Iran has fired several drone attack waves overnight, with interceptions reported in the Eastern Province. No injuries or damage have been reported.

Bahrain

Sirens were triggered last night and this morning, with no confirmed injuries or damage.

Jordan

Shrapnel fell in the southern environs of Amman this morning, causing no confirmed injuries or damage.

Lebanon

At least six people have been killed near Sidon overnight. Israeli airstrikes have also been reported this morning in Beirut; injuries and damage have not been confirmed.

Travel

Maritime

A Chinese-owned, Panama-flagged ship transited the "pay-to-pass" corridor between Larak and Qeshm islands overnight.

Advice

- Do not travel to the Middle East.
- Avoid all travel within the region unless safe travel can be guaranteed.
- Shelter in place in a secure location.
- Follow instructions from local authorities and any national embassy guidelines.
- Monitor official updates and ensure phones are set up to receive alerts.
- Avoid any demonstrations or gatherings in the region.
- Globally, reconsider travel to any locations with links to Israel or Judaism.
