

## High and Extreme Severity Events: March 24, 2026

### Conflict Between US, Israel, Gulf Countries and Iran

#### Israel

- At least eight individuals were injured in the Safed area during the night hours of March 24, 2026.
- Three people were injured and structural damage was recorded after shrapnel from interception attempts fell in Bnei Brak and Petah Tikva during the night hours of March 24, 2026.
- One person was killed and two were injured after 30 rockets were fired at northern areas during the evening hours of March 24, 2026.
- The Home Front Command extended existing defense policy guidelines until 20:00 local time on March 26, 2026.
- The extreme risk level reflects sustained rocket and UAV threats across northern, central, and southern Israel.

#### Kuwait

- Power outages were ongoing across multiple areas following debris fall during the early morning hours of March 24, 2026.
- Air defenses were active and engaging hostile missiles and UAVs in Kuwaiti airspace during the overnight hours of March 23-24, 2026.
- Authorities confirmed interceptions might result in sounds of explosions.

#### Bahrain

- The Ministry of Interior confirmed sirens were sounded nationwide during the late night hours of March 24, 2026.
- The Ministry of Interior confirmed sirens were sounded nationwide during the night hours of March 24, 2026.
- The extreme risk level reflects the threat of Iranian missile and UAV intrusions targeting Bahrain.

#### Regional Context

- The Israel Defense Forces claimed its air force struck the main security headquarters of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps in Tehran on March 23, 2026.

- An Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps spokesperson stated Iran fully controls the Strait of Hormuz on March 23, 2026.
- The spokesperson ruled out mine-laying and stated Iran would use every possible means to ensure security.
- Amazon Web Services operations in Bahrain were disrupted by UAV activity on March 23, 2026.
- Iran's ambassador to the United Nations sent a letter accusing Jordan of facilitating US and Israeli strikes against Iran.
- Iranian state-linked media identified Jordan's Aqaba Thermal Power Station and al-Samra Power Generation Station as critical infrastructure targets.
- The Jordanian Army announced over 240 Iranian-launched UAVs and missiles had targeted Jordan since February 28, 2026.
- The US Embassy in Muscat issued a shelter-in-place advisory during the night hours of March 23, 2026, for US nationals in Oman.
- The advisory was lifted for Muscat but remained in effect across the rest of Oman.
- Embassy personnel were restricted to movement within a 50-km radius of the embassy.

#### Maritime Threats

- Maritime travel through the Strait of Hormuz, Gulf of Oman, and Persian Gulf remained extremely dangerous due to sustained likelihood of maritime attacks.
- Iran's claims of control over the Strait of Hormuz heightened concerns about potential disruptions to maritime transit.
